May 2023 Newsletter

I think we have had everything thrown at us this month in terms of weather...wind, rain, some chilly nights and sun too - but at last we have been finally able to use the school play field at lunchtimes...which is always a sure sign summer IS finally here!

One of the downsides of the warmer weather, and something I have mentioned just once or twice before(!) in Newsletters, is school uniform, and more particularly, the **naming of items of school uniform.** The extract below is from the April Newsletter, it says it all...

I know I have said what I am about to say many times before(!!) but as we head into the Summer Term and the weather - hopefully - gets warmer and sunnier, please could I once again ask that all items of school clothing are named, most

especially sweatshirts and cardigans that, when the sun comes out and the air heats up, are the first things that the children remove and often abandon. It is then nigh-on impossible returning these to the individuals if the items are unnamed and unidentifiable.'

We have had the **Lost Property** 'Bin' out at the school gate (Greenbelt) this last week and anything left in it, unclaimed, this evening (Friday 26th May) will be sent to a clothing bank to be recycled. Any really good quality school uniform items will be sold at the PSA's next 'used school clothing sale'. I hope you have all checked!!

May saw **Y6** pupils sit their **SATs**. Nationally, as always, there was 'interesting press' about the tests; all I will say is that *our* pupils conducted themselves really well throughout the 4 days (Tuesday 9/5/23-Friday12/5/23) and 'what now will be, will be!'. The national release date for results is not until the very last week of term, so they will be sent out to parents just before we break up for the Summer Holidays! (Nationally the powers that be always forget that Leicestershire schools finish their school year a week or more ahead of other counties, making it a bit of a last-minute rush!).

I would remind you that **our term finishes this year at 3.20pm on <u>Thursday</u> 13th July** (Friday is an INSET Day for staff). We have been reminded - and therefore have to pass that message on - that pupils should **not** be going on holiday ahead of that date. Schools are asked to *track* pupils who are 'ill' in the last few days of term -in fact, in the last few days of *any* term, or ½ term, to be certain that the reported illness is actually an illness; I think you will understand the message behind this expectation on schools.

'Exceptional circumstances' requiring **pupil absence** do not include 'cheaper flights or accommodation' etc



Please note that future **Term Dates** can be found on our school website: Key Information tab > Term Dates.

These are set up to, and include, the school year 2024-25. On that webpage it also clearly states that:

'If you type 'term dates for Mountfields Lodge' into some search engines the WRONG holiday dates are flagged up; these are NOT our dates nor have we approved or sanctioned these; please be careful!'

Just to bring this to your attention; if you want to know our school term dates, refer to our school website.

A **Transition Day** for current EYFS-Y5 pupils is arranged for Friday 7th July in school (slightly different for the High Schools; De Lisle most especially); so, it is important that pupils are in school on that date.

Pupil School Reports will have been sent home on Friday 30th June – the previous Friday - so do please look out for those when the time comes. As always, these reports will be addressed to you and should not come home already opened; we will remind our pupils of this fact!






Worldwide Wednesday Menu

School Lunch Price Increase

We have tried really hard not to increase the cost of our School Lunches and have been selling ours at the cheapest rate possible for as long as we can. However, we now find ourselves in the position that we are going to have to increase our meals in line with all of the other local schools. The costs of our foodstuffs have risen sharply, and even though we source locally and 'shop around', we cannot sustain the current costs.

Therefore, as from the beginning of the Autumn Term (August 31st 2023) the price of a school meal **will be increasing to £2.50 per meal/day.**

Breakfast Club Price Increase.

The cost of our Cool B4 School Breakfast Club is also set to increase from the beginning of next school year - from Thursday 31st August 2023. **The cost will increase to £4.00 per session, or £4.50 per session with a breakfast.** As with our School Meal increase, we have tried hard to keep the cost as low as we can for as long as we can, but have had to finally succumb to an increase.

MMR Vaccination Reminder – Public Health

A reminder to check children, teenagers and young adults are fully up to date with their vaccinations.

There has been an increase in cases of measles in England over the past few months. Measles is a highly infectious disease, which can lead to serious health problems in children, for example meningitis, pneumonia and in rare cases, long-term-disability, or death. Symptoms include a high fever, sore red watery eyes, small white spots in the mouth and a blotchy red-brown rash (which starts on the face and behind the ears before spreading to the rest of the body). It is particularly easy to catch through close contact, in environments where children mix freely, especially during the summer holidays when they attend summer camps/clubs/festivals.

It is important for parents or guardians of young children, teenagers, and young adults to check they are up to date with their measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccinations. Normally children are offered the first dose of the MMR vaccine at the age of one year and the second dose around 3 years old. Parents or guardians can check if their children have had both doses by asking the GP surgery or they can check the vaccination status record online through the GP online service (if registered with this service.)

Please contact your GP to arrange vaccination if your child has missed doses.

If you think that your child has symptoms of measles, it is advised to stay at home and contact your GP or NHS 111 for advice, before visiting a medical centre. This will help prevent the spread of this high infectious viral disease.
