Sportshall Athletics Champions for Third Consecutive Year!

An amazing team of 18 Year 5 and 6 children competed at the North Charnwood Sportshall Athletics competition at the end of February. The event required the children to compete in both running relays and either throwing or jumping activities.

The children all demonstrated their versatility and beat the 9 other competing schools by 4 clear points. This is the third consecutive year that Mountfields Lodge has won this event.

The team then went on to represent North Charnwood in the County Schools Championships at Loughborough University on 31st March.



In the County Championships the team competed with determination each of them striving to get the fastest time, distance or number possible. Their teamwork and sporting attitude was recognised by the sports leaders and the team were award the Spirit of the Games – well deserved.
