# Mountfields Lodge School Library

Two years ago, the PSA began developing the idea of transforming the school library and fundraised approximately £5,000 to initiate the project. This year, with interior design and project management support, a design was created for an inclusive space with a Forest of Fairy Tales theme.

We have been extremely fortunate to receive additional funding, including £2,000 in donations from parents and £1,500 from the Barratt Homes Community Foundation. One of our parents working at Barratt Homes also engaged further community partners to support the project over the summer:

- BD Living supplied and fitted all joinery.
- Abingdon and Novus provided and fitted the carpet.
- Dulux gifted all paint.
- Illustrator and author Emma Carlisle created large-scale artwork, which has been integrated into the space.
- Waterstones set up a PSA account offering a 20% discount on all new books, helping to maintain the library's stock and provide a sustainable budget for ongoing procurement.

As a school we are really fortunate to have a group of dedicated library volunteers, who regularly give their time to support children's reading, are excited to bring the refreshed library to life. They have worked tirelessly over the past few weeks organising the many books onto the new shelving.

This term, Years 3 and 4 have been diving into the amazing world of Ancient Egypt – and what a start they've had!

It all started with a brilliant Ancient Egypt Day, where the children explored artefacts, dressed up, and even had a go at mummifying tomatoes. It was a great way to bring history to life and get everyone excited about what's to come.

Since then, they have been learning all about Tutankhamun, the famous boy king, journeying deep underground into his tomb and discovering some of the incredible treasures that were buried with him.

# Year 5


